FERPA Notice

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA), initially called the Buckley Amendment, allows students at an institution of higher education to control outside access to their education records, including requests for information from their parents, guardians, or others as designated by the student. Without a student's written consent, The University of Texas at San Antonio may not disclose information from a student's education records to outside third parties. However, students can also provide a standing release allowing UTSA to disclose information to others. After having done so, to revoke a Student Authorization to Release Education Records form the following declaration must be completed:
