

The Border County Program (BCP) is a tuition assistance program that allows eligible F-1/J-1 visa students from Mexico with limited financial resources to pay Texas in-state tuition. This program is need-based and is not a competitive scholarship.

Instructions:

- Complete the 'First-time BCP application' and submit with all additional documentation: •
 - Affidavit of Support (If Applicable)
 - Bank Affidavit Form
 - A paystub from each of the previous 3 months prior to submission of application OR Certified Accountant Verification letter showing annual salary earned
- Do not leave any blank spaces. ٠
- *Use "N/A" if requested information does not apply to you.* •
- Attach a copy of your valid passport from Mexico. ٠

Participants must:

- Be a citizen or permanent resident of Mexico.
- NOT have a U.S. Permanent Resident card or a PENDING application for U.S. permanent residency.
- Plan to return to Mexico upon completion of the education program.
- Be admitted to a UTSA degree program (Intensive English Program students are not eligible for the Border County Program).
- Demonstrate the required financial need.
- Enroll and maintain a full-time status each semester (12 hours for Undergraduate; 9 hours for Graduate).
- Maintain a minimum institutional GPA (2.0 for Undergraduate; 3.0 for Graduate).

IMPORTANT: Every year all Border County Program participants must re-apply and be recertified before the beginning of the fall semester in order to continue receiving in-state tuition. In addition, acceptance of in-state tuition based on the Border County Program decision does not guarantee issuance of an I-20. You must still meet all International Students requirements for the I-20.

My application must be typed; handwritten applications will not be accepted.

I must submit my application in a timely manner; prior to the respective application deadline.

My application will not be reviewed, nor will a decision be made until after all required documentation has been submitted.

I understand the process and documents to request my Form I-20 or DS-2019 is a separate process from my Border County application.

I understand that submission of fraudulent documentation or a misrepresentation of financial information may disgualify my BCP application.

I understand that I cannot have a U.S. permanent residency card or pending application for U.S. permanent residency in order to qualify and continue receiving benefits from the BCP.

I understand that by submitting an application, I am stating that all information provided is true and accurate, and that I meet all the eligibility requirements.
